The afternoon of talks (including the talk by Doug Allan) and activities is FREE of charge.

The activities will be followed by an evening performance of Prokofiev's much-loved work for children *Peter and the Wolf* given in celebration of the Heisenberg Ensemble's 30th anniversary. The work will be paired with the wonderful 1st horn concerto by Richard Strauss and Ravel's *Mother Goose*.
